

A Hard Luck Story

Steven Toczko of Quincy had long looked forward to retirement. His dream was to be a model engineer and he had put together a great shop with all the machine tools he would need.

Then came the horrendous crash out of nowhere. Steven's truck was rear ended by a Crown Victoria so hard that the entire front half of the Crown Vic was demolished. Steven doesn't remember the second car that hit him because he was knocked unconscious when he got rear ended.

The two impacts resulted in the crushing of two vertebrae in Steven's neck as well as a spinal cord compression injury. Fortunately, he was not totally paralyzed, but his injuries and their aftermath are severe. Steven's ability to move his upper body is limited and painful. He can use his arms and hands as long as he watches what they are doing, because there is no nerve feedback from them to guide him. His overall pain limits him to 4 hours sleep a night at most.

In despair that he might never be able to use the tools he had accumulated, Steven called the Charles River Museum of Industry and asked to be put in touch with someone from NEMES. He wanted to find someone to sell his tools to who would appreciate them. So, I called him up and we've had a couple of chats.

We ended up agreeing that it's too early yet to give up on being a machinist. Although Steven is pessimistic that he will ever recover sufficiently, he is continuing his physical therapy and one can only hope. What he REALLY needs is someone to talk too. He lives alone and his limited mobility keeps him in all day.

If you have a half hour or so, give Steven a call. He's a great guy to talk to, about just about anything. And he will really appreciate it.
